

CNAs give patients important social and emotional support. This job requires compassion and a desire to make people comfortable and happy.

You may start working as a CNA while you finish high school. Some technical or post-secondary healthcare education fields require CNA certification.

Many CNAs go on to other professional healthcare careers, such as radiology or laboratory technicians, healthcare administrators, licensed and registered nurses, medical assistants, physical therapists and doctors.



The Certified Nursing Assistant Training program meets the South Dakota Board of Nursing requirements for CNAs. CNAs work under the supervision of a registered nurse, LPN or other supervisory staff.
